COURSE DESCRIPTION

We have the Visiting Professor Program, through which on the last Sunday of each month, a researcher professor, of recognized ability in surgery or similar science, is received in Rio de Janeiro and makes a preliminary meeting with the graduate course coordinator, and with the supervising professors, discussing difficulties related to graduate courses and research, and how to overcome them, according to the experience of each visiting professor. On Monday morning, the visiting professor gives a lecture presenting a theme developed by him/her or his/her research line. Attendance is mandatory for all interns and graduate students. After the meeting, the graduate students and interns discuss their research projects, their progress and preliminary results with the visiting professor. Preference will always be given to professors involved in research and graduate studies.

In addition, every Wednesday, at 6 pm, a scientific meeting takes place with the presence of all graduate students and the members of the center. This meeting, which is attended by about 50 people, on average, is attended by professors, graduate students and interns of other graduate programs at UERJ (morphology and biology), and other universities and institutions in Rio de Janeiro. In this meeting, participants watch the presentation of one paper per week, chosen by the supervising professors, and presented by a graduate student or intern (according to a scale), and discuss this paper, with the supervisors, for about 30 minutes (10 of presentation and 20 of discussion). In another 45 minutes, also on a scale, the research projects of the graduate program in surgery and their difficulties and partial results are discussed. This meeting, which has been running weekly for 13 years, brought together several research laboratories.

These meetings are mandatory for all graduate students, regardless of the key focus area, and are worth variable credits, depending on the workload, at the discretion of the Program coordinator.
